Niddrie Burn Restoration Project & Edinburgh Royal Infirmary Link Road

What is this Project?

This project will restore the Niddrie Burn water course through Hunters Hall Park and create a new public transport link road that will link Greendykes Road with the Edinburgh Royal Infirmary.



What's happened so far?

- A detailed archaeological survey of the area has been completed.
- An open day was held on the 16th April to show off the archaeological finds.
- Trees and vegetation along the route of the new burn have been removed.
- The "Gulliver" statue has been removed and the commissioning of a piece of public art with input from local groups has now begun.
- The contractor Carillion Construction has been appointed to carry out the project.

What happens next?

- Work to grout up the existing mine workings has started and will be completed by the end of August 2011.
- A fence will be erected around the whole site in the next few weeks to protect the public from the construction work on site.
- The site offices will be located opposite Greendykes House in Greendykes Road.
- Site traffic will access the site from Little France Drive.
- The Rights of way along the south of the site to Little France Drive and from Greendykes Road to Little France Drive will be maintained with minor alterations to these routes during the project.
- The project is due for completion by the end of September 2012.
